Camperships are awarded every year to Scouts who could not otherwise attend a Chief Seattle Council Summer Camp, Cub Scout Day Camp or Cub Scout Resident Camp without financial assistance. Camperships are provided through donations by concerned community groups, individuals and memorial funds.

Generally, half of the camp fees or less is awarded. Full camperships are seldom awarded. It is the hope of the Campership Committee that the Scout, his family and his unit will work together to earn as much of the fee as possible. It is part of the Scouting ideal that boys earn their own way.

Both sides of the application must be completed and are due by May 9, after which funds will be awarded as they are made available. All information on this form will be kept confidential.
