All Tiger Cubs, Cub Scouts, Webelos, adult staff volunteers and den guides who attend all four days will receive a camp T-shirt to wear to camp.

Camp Scholarships

"Campships" are awarded every year to Scouts who could not otherwise attend a summer day Camp. Contact your pack day camp coordinator for an application. All information is kept confidential.

Refunds

A 50% refund of fees paid may be issued in the case of accident, illness, or extreme extenuating circumstances, if requested in writing at least 15 days prior to the event. **Refunds will not be made at camp.**

Supervision

The Boy Scouts of America requires a minimum of two adults on all trips and outings (two deep leadership). All participants, youth and adults, must complete the *Health History (Class One) and Day Camp Registration form*. Submit these forms along with your pack's fee payment.

Program Support

Packs **MUST** provide adult staff members to assist with day camp. **Please consult your district day camp coordinator for your specific adult staffing requirements.**

How do I register my son?

Contact your pack day camp coordinator. They have all the forms and can coordinate adult support for camp. If your pack doesn't have a day camp coordinator it's easy to become one. All the registration materials and instructions are available at the camping section of www.seattlebsa.org.

Individuals or dens can sign up to go to camp on their own as long as they meet the minimum adult supervision requirements.

How does camp work?

Cub Scout day camp involves the efforts of pack and district volunteers to create an educational, inspirational and fun experience for Tiger Cubs, Cub Scouts and Webelos. A Scout professional and volunteer camp director supervise a staff of dedicated district volunteers. Directors are certified by the National Camping School of the Boy Scouts of America. The camp program is carefully designed by a committee of experienced camp leaders, guided by parents' suggestions.

Orientation

Each district will offer day camp orientation and training to all adults participating as den guides and staff. It is essential that every participating adult in your pack attend one of these orientation sessions.
